**15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary**

NEP 2020 emphasizes multidisciplinary educations at all levels and this approach aims to equip students with a broader knowledge base and skills set to tackle the challenges of the future. Avvaiyar Govt. College for Women approaches all of its activities with an interdisciplinary perspective. In order to fulfil the goals of NEP, faculty members have actively engaged in the development, reorganisation, and enhancement of the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework and have embraced multidisciplinary teaching practise. It is now forming a task force to carry out the NEP with utmost care. Students Major and Minor Disciplinary Courses, Multidisciplinary courses (MLD), Ability Enhancement Courses (AECC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value-Added Courses (VAC). SECs also help students get ready for research projects, internships, and apprenticeships. Encouraging multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary study, AGCW fosters multiplicity of perspectives.

**16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

The Academic Bank of Credit is a transformative concept that aims to provide students with more flexibility in their education. It operates on a credit-based system, allowing students to accumulate academic credits that can be transferred and recognized by various educational institutions. This innovative approach empowers students and assists institutions in meeting the evolving quality standards set by NAAC. Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) allows students to choose courses from different institutions, fostering a dynamic learning experience. The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) has been implemented and all our students have successfully enrolled and got ABC ID.

**17. Skill development:**

The institution's takes much care in imparting skill development efforts through its enrichment of curriculum. Department of Maths conducted an "International Seminar on Advances in Mathematics" (ISAM -2022) from 21st- 23rd December, 2022. IQAC and Placement Cell, Career Guidance Cell have organized "A Mega Job Fair" on 11 June 2022. 12 students were selected and recruited by various companies. Placement Cell in collaboration with Deepam for Education, Empowerment, and Development, Pondicherry organized "Self- Learning Google Course". About 150 students were benefitted

and certified by Google and NASSCOM Foundation on 27 th August 2022. Also, in collaboration with Department of B. Com (Corporate Secretaryship) the cell organised a workshop on 29 th November 2022.

**18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)**

AGCW plays a crucial role in the integration of the Indian knowledge system into modern education. Here are some of the essential roles that colleges play in this integration. N.S.S unit of our college organized yoga session on 'International Yoga Day'. Besides, our students also celebrate Independence Day, Saraswati Pooja, and Pongal Celebrations with due reverence.

AGCW College bases its education on student outcomes. Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) courses offer students a great deal of opportunity to develop in terms of analytical abilities, creative thinking, and problem-solving skills. Several strategies are used to guarantee outcome-based education, including interactive classrooms, the use of IT resources like PowerPoint presentations, prompt distribution of books, and advice on how to get ready for exams. Additionally, there are a lot of student events held at the institution all year long, including extracurricular and cocurricular pursuits run by student organisations and departmental organisations. College Library has a treasure trove of 37908 books, 3028 Book Bank books and 2323 Reference books. Our college provides access of books and Journals to Students and faculties from NLIST Resources.

**20.Distance education/online education:**

The institution provides ample flexibility to the students to learn and explore through ICT- teaching is made possible by Wi-Fi enabled departments, smart classrooms, and well-stocked computer labs. The faculty was trained intensively to adapt to the changing scenario. The students were encouraged to interact in virtual classrooms. The use of technologies like LCD Projectors, Smart classrooms, and Language Lab has made online education quite efficient. During the pandemic most of the classes were conducted in the online mode. The faculty responded to the difficulties of the threat to education posed by the pandemic and changed the instructional approach. Online education was quite effective as it provided a better platform to share knowledge, notes, and power point presentations.
